Manchester United's two most successful managers have undoubtedly been Sir Matt Busby and Sir Alex Ferguson. Sir Matt Busby, who came to the club in 1945, was instrumental in helping United win five League championships and two F.A. Cups.

In 1958, tragedy struck United when their young team, affectionately known as the 'Busby Babes', was almost wiped out in an air crash in Munich while returning from a European Cup tie. However, ten years later, still under the reign of Busby, a United team including superstars like George Best and Bobby Charlton became the first English club to lift the European Cup.

In 1986, Scot Alex Ferguson, was appointed manager. At the start of his career at Old Trafford, United were going backwards in the League and it looked as though his days as manager were numbered. However, the F.A. Cup win of 1990 witnessed a change for the better in the club's fortunes, which continued with the European Cup Winners' Cup success in 1991.

Since then, United seem to have had the Midas touch. With the advent of the Premier League in 1992, fans saw United triumph 26 years after their previous title win in 1967.

In the 1994 season United went one better and won the double, beating Chelsea 4-0 in the F.A. Cup final! The 1996 season also saw United win the double - making them the only team, at the time, ever to have won the 'double double'. In the 1999 season, United became the first-ever English team to win the treble, clinching the Premier League title, the F.A. Cup and the European Cup!

IMPORTANT!

All pieces with red dots are not part of your Puzz-3D. Set these pieces aside while you build your puzzle and only discard them when you are sure your puzzle is complete. Be careful! Some unmarked pieces may remain interlocked with red-dot pieces. Also, some waste pieces are too small to be marked with red dots, so check these before discarding.

BUILDING TIPS

Vertical portions of your puzzle (such as walls) fit onto the horizontal portions (floors, rooftops, etc.) as shown. It's best to build the base first, then attach the puzzle wall pieces to the base. Handling Puzz-3D pieces can create static cling. Keep an eye on your surroundings and your sleeves while you are building. Keep pets away! They love to play with the foam pieces too, although the foam is non-toxic.
